#### What Happens at our Meetings

The **Membership Year** runs from January to December

**Speaker Meetings** are normally January to April, and September to November. This leaves the summer clear for our gardening ventures, trips etc

**Doors open** at 1.45pm with the talk starting promptly at 2.30pm. This gives you time to look at the Plant sale table, the Events table and buy your raffle tickets. (Note: the AGM and Celebrity Speaker meetings may be slightly different so please check)

**Tea/Coffee and cake** is served before the talk starts. Costs are £1 for tea/coffee and £1 for a piece of home-made cake.

**Raffle Tickets...** £1 for a strip of five tickets

**Plant Sales Table** is at every speaker meeting, usually outside. You can donate your surplus plants or you can sell them for your chosen price, and pay us a little commission. More details about how it works and the presentation of your sale plants are on our website www.dorsethps.org.uk

**Events Table...** will have details and/or to book on day trips.

Volunteers... Liz Underwood (Committee) organises our volunteers to help with running our meetings, or even baking a cake! If you'd like to help just grab Liz at a meeting or email us. ### **Communicating with the Committee**

Our email address <u>dorsethps@gmail.com</u> is used to communicate with you so you can easily recognise who the email is from. Please use the same email address as your main method for contacting us. Our Group Secretary, Gilly Baxter, manages our email Inbox and Gilly will either deal with your email herself, or forward it to the relevant member of the committee. This email address is also displayed on all our communications (eg at the top of this newsletter). **NB:** This 'single point of contact' for you saves you having to decide who to email, and also means personal email addresses of the committee are not advertised and so are less likely to be 'spammed'. <u>Please do not</u> email Debbie Steel with your queries even if you still have her email address as she is no longer on the committee and so it's extra work for her to pass on queries.

#### Membership Fee from January 2023

At the AGM back in February there was a consensus from those attending that our membership fee was 'too cheap' and should be increased in 2023.

However, after discussion in committee, and considering the cost of membership to the national HPS is mandatory for our members, we have decided not to increase our fee - but to simplify. The annual fee will be **£5 per person** - this means there will be NO 'Joint' membership category. Our method of communicating with you is primarily by email which helps to keep our costs down, (national HPS produce hard copy Newsletters etc which are posted to you). So this single membership category will also enable us to simplify our own administration of members.

**NB:** Membership renewals will start in October, Forms and procedure will be distributed with the October Newsletter.

### 2023 Holiday & Day Trips - Update

After a lot of research and deliberation, the Events Team have decided that we will **not** be organising a Dorset HPS Holiday in 2023.

The reasons for this decision are many and varied. In this post-covid world, the way people travel has changed and the booking process is now far more difficult. We do not yet know the impact that fuel increases will have on our pricing structure and some businesses will not commit to an advance booking because of the uncertainties surrounding fuel costs and staffing shortages.

So, we will be having a break (!) in 2023 and will review our plans next year with hopes of running a holiday in 2024. We would like to thank all those members who have supported and enjoyed the holidays over the last 12 years and we hope to see you on a holiday with us in the future.

We will be organising extra day trips throughout 2023 to help fill the void. Watch this space.
