#### What Happens at our Meetings

## Our Plant Fair – Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> May – 2.30 to 4.30pm

We had a very successful and gorgeous sunny day last year for our annual Plant Fair. This event is open to the public as well as our members. Last year's set up will be repeated with plant sale tables in the car park, while refreshments can be bought in the hall.

If you're a keen propagator and/or have split your perennials then for just £10 you can have your own sales table and sell your own plants with no further payment to us. Or perhaps share a table with a friend. You can sell anything you like – not just perennials. May is an ideal time for vegetables, and annuals and all sorts. Please just ensure they are well rooted in their pots ie not potted within days.

Alternatively, you can donate your plants to us for our 'Donations Table' where funds raised go into DHPS funds towards events and speakers.
