## For the Love of Roses – Gillian Taylor

Gillian is an enthusiastic gardener and plantswoman (AND one of our members) with a passion for roses. This talk is the story of how she came to love roses so much, from having only two a few years ago she has progressed to growing around 250 varieties in her collection. Her talk will discuss the diverse types of rose that are available, where to buy them, how to use them in various garden settings, where to see them, their care and suggestions for companion plantings.
